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1	School aims and values	Our school aims and values are agreed by the whole campus Achieving, Belonging, Caring Respect, Resilience and most of all Kindness We review these regularly through assemblies and class work
2	Pupil and Parents Voices	We seek the views via the pupil and parent councils. We put out surveys to parents, staff and pupils. We also use the UNHCR questionnaire for Rights Respecting Schools
3	Pupil Council and Executive Pupil Council	Each school on the campus has a pupil council with a focus on the health and wellbeing of their peers. Every term they form one executive council to ensure campus wide needs are met.
4	Helping Others' Days	We support Guide Dogs by sponsoring a puppy. We took part in the Wear Something Orange fund raiser for Maggie's centres.
5	Kindness Award	Everyday staff award points for acts of kindness they see at the end of the week assembly the class with the most points wins the Kindness Cup for the week. Certificates are presented weekly by class teachers; these are presented at the assembly with parents invited to come and see the presentations.
6	Eco events	We have enterprise and gardening groups, planting areas around the school. We have grown our own vegetables and cooked and shared meals with guests from them.
7	Kindness Day	We celebrated Kindness Day and Anti-Bulling week with assemblies. We are using the materials created by Dornoch to promote kindness and reduce bullying.
8	Outdoor activities	We have large grounds which are used every day.
9	Care home community links	Our Nursery pupils visit the local care home.
10	Buddies	All of our P7 pupils are buddies to the children in the nursery and P1 class. They look after the P1s in school and go to help play games. They go into the nursery to read stories. They are also lunch time helpers and are undertaking sports leaders' qualification to lead playground games.
11	Kindness Activities	Kindness UK resources. Each class thinking of what represents kindness to them. We discussed these with parents. Pupils shared what they were doing with parents, and we put information in our newsletter. We have used the Bucket of Kindness Book with younger pupils. The classes compete for the Kindness Cup each week.
12	Harvest and Christmas	We held a harvest festival service and asked for donations of flowers and food. We shared the donations locally. The children went from the school to take the harvest gifts. We invite residents if they are able to attend our Christmas play. We hold a Christmas service in the local church and invite the community to attend.
13	Tree Planting/ Gardening	We took part in a potato planting event. We harvested the potatoes and held a Bangers and Mash event We have joined forces with a local gardening group to restore our garden and raised beds. We have planted vegetables that the nursery children made into soup.
14	Citizenship Groups	We have an ECO group, and we are just setting up a Junior Road safety group. We give out awards in assembly for "Responsible Citizens and Effective Contributors". Our Pupil Council play a big role in promoting citizenship in the school.
15	Health and Wellbeing	Health and Wellbeing is one of three major strands of our School Improvement plan which is shared with our parents. The staff hold regular working groups to

16	Caring for Animals	We sponsor a guide dog and we have leant about caring for animals.
17	Learning for Sustainability	As part of our Silver Accreditation for UNHCR Rights Respecting award the whole school became involved in Learning for Sustainability projects
18	Assemblies	We hold an assembly every week, we focus on important celebrations as well as the schools aims and values. We link with outside speakers who join our assemblies.
19	Mental Health Awareness	The pupils know that class teachers and the Deputy head can always be approached to talk. We have links to a counsellor who can work with individuals. We carry out resilience work with classes. We share the weekly online safety bulletins from National online safety organisation.
20	Remembrance	We held the two-minute silence and sold poppies. The Poppy Bus history museum came to visit the school.
21	Newsletters	We produce a regular newsletter to keep parents informed about school activities. We share our kindness stories and share photographs of the week's kindest class.
22	Kindness UK	We celebrated UK Kindness Day and have been using the resources from your website. The pupils completed the word searches and drew pictures of kind activities.
